Invitation to new models of care event

It's been two years since we carried out a comprehensive engagement programme across Fylde and Wyre in relation to our 2030 Vision for health and care. As part of that engagement process, we wanted to make sure that our key stakeholders, including partners, patients and the public, were able to make a meaningful contribution to our plans and integrate our priorities with theirs.

Under our 'vision' we are continuing to develop our 'new models of care', which put patients at the centre of their treatment. The new models are made up of extensive care, enhanced primary care and episodic care. These services are less fragmented, better coordinated and much less confusing to patients.

We have looked at our population in its entirety when developing these services. Extensive care aims to help that small proportion of the population aged over 60 with two or more complex conditions. Enhanced primary care is designed for the slightly larger group of people with one complex condition. Episodic care is aimed at helping the rest of the population when they need support – for instance when you have a cough or cold.

The overriding aim is to use our resources better so that patients have an improved experience of care.

In relation to extensive care, we consulted at length with our stakeholders in the early part of 2014, before the service went live in June this year – it is already proving successful.

Under our 'In Fylde & Wyre' engagement programme, we would now like to seek your views on episodic care and enhanced primary care, including integrated neighbourhood teams. We're holding a number of events where you can find out more about our new models of care, ask questions and help to shape the service.

The events will:

- explain how these services will help to address the challenges currently faced by the NHS locally;
- 'walk' you through thinking to date about how the new service will work; and
- seek your feedback which will be fed into the service design process.
